	Hebrews 12: <sup>3</sup> Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.
3.	Is God's good good for?
	"Herod and his men dressed Jesus in a royal robe as a mocking response to His claim to be a king. But when a Christian thinks about Jesus in that robe, enduring the taunts and ridicule of the soldiers, we see the proof that Jesus is the heroic King we've always wanted. He is the One who is great and who is good. He alone is worthy of all our allegiance and trust, both in all the difficulties in all the details of our lives today, and as we face our eternal destiny. He's the King. And He's our King." (Mike McKinley)
