## The Shepherd King

Part of the antidote to these kinds of responses is found in recognizing that Jesus our king is a \_\_\_\_\_ leader of our lives.

David experiences God as a shepherd, in a very personal, intimate way. ...[He] emphasizes the first person singular. ...'my' savior... leading 'me,' ...with 'me,' ... comforting 'me.' ...David knows on an experiential level that his shepherd gets him, knows what he is going through, and is there with him when he is going through it. David has a transparent, safe, and secure relational attachment with God. ... David knows he is never alone." (Tom Nelson)
