From chapter 5 through chapter 7 (known as the Sermon on the Mount), Jesus focuses on values that guide his people when they are submitted, surrendered, and activated by God's rule and \_\_\_\_\_.

### The Sermon on the Mount

1. A Christian's \_\_\_\_\_ (5:3-12)

Value: When we're submitted, surrendered, and activated by God's rule and reign, we pursue God's right-side-up values in an upside-down world.

2. A Christian's \_\_\_\_\_ (5:13-16)

Value: When we're submitted, surrendered, and activated by God's rule and reign, we impact the world for Christ by being different from the \_\_\_\_\_.

"The essential theme of the whole Bible from beginning to end is that God's historical purpose is to call out a people for himself; that this people is a 'holy' people, set apart from the world to belong to him and to obey him; and that its vocation is to be true to its identity, that is, to be 'holy' or 'different' in all its outlook and behavior." (John Stott)

#### Leviticus 18:1-4

There is no single paragraph of the Sermon on the Mount in which this contrast between Christian and non-Christian standards is not drawn. ...Sometimes it is the Gentiles or pagan nations with whom Jesus contrasts his followers. ...At other times Jesus contrasts his disciples not with Gentiles but...with religious people....'" (John Stott)

Jesus doesn't show us a "third way," he shows us the "\_\_\_\_\_," the way it's supposed to be.

3. A Christian's \_\_\_\_\_ (5:17-48)

# Value: When we're submitted, surrendered, and activated by God's rule and reign, we guard and tend to our hearts and minds, pursuing heart renovation, formation, and \_\_\_\_\_\_.

4. A Christian's \_\_\_\_\_ (6:1-18)

Value: When we're submitted, surrendered, and activated by God's rule and reign, we do acts of piety for an audience of One, seeking God himself, his rewards, and his \_\_\_\_\_.
