"those who say to God ,'thy will be done,' and those to whom God says, 'thy will be done.'" (CS Lewis)

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We cooperate with the of good.
3. Holding your securely.
We move away from being passive or paralyzed into being & able.
Ephesians 1: 11-13 In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will, in orde that we, who were the first to put our hope in Christ, might be for the praise of his glory. And you also were included in Christ when you heard the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation. When you believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit.
"I liken them to two ropes going through two holes in the ceiling and over a pulley above. If I wish to support myself by them, I must cling to them both. If I cling only to one and not the other, I go down. I read the many teachings of the Bible regarding God's election, predestination, his chosen, and so on. I read also the many teachings regarding 'whosoever will may come' and urging people to exercise their responsibility as human beings. These seeming contradictions cannot be reconciled by the puny human mind. With childlike faith, I cling to both ropes, fully confidant that in eternity I will see that both strands of truth are, after all, of one piece." (RB Kuiper)
